RESPECT HONESTY PERSIVERENCE


We are now working on key behaviours that embody these values and they will become the basis of our revamped 'Values Tree' and reward system. We will keep you informed.

You may have noticed that parking enforcement officers have been outside school on a regular basis. Please do not risk a fine by parking illegally. Safeguarding



Please can I remind all adults that the use of mobile phones on site is prohibited.

This is standard school safeguarding protocol.

CAR PARK

A reminder that the school car park is for staff only. Please do not use it to drop children off or wait for them at the end of the day. If you are spotted using the car park without permission, please do not be offended when you are asked to leave. This is for the safety of staff and children attending school. Thank you.

COVID UPDATES

COVID Guidance Update:

 As from Thursday 24th February 2022, COVID guidance as law was dropped, although all government guidance remains unchanged.

Current guidance regarding the need for PCR tests.

- Using LFD testing is now longer a legal requirement. Although, until Easter, staff in school will continue to test twice weekly as we feel this is the best way to keep our community safe and to ultimately keep the school open.
- PLEASE NOTE THAT ALL GOVERNMENT GUIDANCE REMAINS THE SAME it is just no longer enforceable through law.
- PLEASE HELP US TO KEEP OUR COMMUNTY SAFE BY CONTINUING TO FOLLOW THE GOVERMENT GUIDANCE BELOW
- If you have NO symptoms but test positive on a lateral flow devise then you no longer need to book a PCR test to confirm the result. You will need to notify the relevant authority and isolate for 10 days unless you test negative on the morning of Day 5 and the morning of Day 6. then you may come out of isolation. If day 5 remains positive then you need to test day 6 and 7 and so on. In order to come out of isolation you need to have a negative result for two consecutive days or reach day 10 when you are automatically released from isolation.
- Please note that if you have symptoms then you are still required to have a confirmation PCR test. (the next government review for this will be at the end of March)
- Please note that if a child is sent home with a high temperature, then as this is listed as a COVID symptom, then your child will need to have a PCR test. If the PCR result comes back as negative then your child may return to school as long as they no longer have a fever.
- We have been advised by Oxfordshire County Council that this is also the case even if the individual has had COVID within the last 90 days. This is because there are now occurrences of reinfection earlier than 3 months.

- If a member of your household tests positive then your child can continue to come to school. There is no longer a legal requirement to LFD test each morning before school but we would strongly encourage you to do so in order to keep our school community running smoothly. We would advise that you do so for 7 days as per the previous government guidance.
- Please continue to notify school of all positive results as we are required to submit these to Oxfordshire County Council.
- Thank you for your continued support and understanding.

Attendance and Lateness

This may be strange to talk about attendance when there has been so much absence due to COVID, but it is something that as a school we monitor on a regular basis. As we enter term 3, we will be looking a little closer at absence patterns. We will obviously take in to account any absences due to COVID, but this attendance analysis will highlight those children whose attendance is low or whose lateness is high. Please note that school starts at 8:55a.m and that we no longer operate a staggered start to the day. As attendance was highlighted as an issue for some groups of children during our last Ofsted inspection, we are expected, more so than normal, to ensure this issue is addressed.

Please do not be offended if you are contacted regarding your child's attendance. This may happen if your child's attendance is below 90% without good reason. In some instances where improvement in attendance is not noted, attendance contracts may need to be agreed with support from the County attendance team if needed.

Please help us to ensure all our children are in school as often as they possibly can be.

School Life App

Some parents are not receiving updates from school via the School Life App because they are only seeing the public site. For safety, school messages are only available to those who have logged in. Parents should log into the app:- just open the app, click the two houses at the top, select log in and enter your user name and password.
