## **School Values**



We have introduced the READ, WRITE, INC scheme throughout school, which will not only help our younger children in Reception and Years 1 and 2, but also offers support to those higher up in the school where it is needed.

## **COVID UPDATES**

From the 11<sup>th</sup> January there are changes regarding the need for PCR tests.

- If you have NO symptoms but test positive on a lateral flow devise, then you no longer need to book a PCR test to confirm the result. You will need to notify the relevant authority and isolate for 10 days unless you test negative on day 6 and 7 on a lateral flow device and then you may come out of isolation. If day 6 remains positive, then you need to test day 7 and 8. In order to come out of isolation you need to have a negative result for two consecutive days or reach day 10 when you are automatically released from isolation.
- Please note that if you have symptoms then you are still required to have confirmation PCR test.
- Please continue to notify school of all positive results as we are required to submit these to Oxfordshire County Council.
- If a member of your household tests positive, then pupils will need to test daily to ensure there is no spread to the school environment.
- As there is no longer a staggered start to the day, please ensure that younger siblings are picked up before walking around to KS2.

## Attendance and Lateness

This may be strange to talk about attendance when there has been so much absence due to COVID, but it is something that as a school we monitor on a regular basis. As we enter term 3 we will be looking a little closer at absence patterns. We will obviously take in to account any absences due to COVID, but this attendance analysis will highlight those children whose attendance is low or whose lateness is high. Please note that school starts at 8:55a.m and that we no longer operate a staggered start to the day. As attendance was highlighted as an issue for some groups of children during our last Ofsted inspection, we are expected, more so than normal, to ensure this issue is addressed.

Please do not be offended if you are contacted regarding your child's attendance. This may happen if your child's attendance is below 90% without good reason. In some instances where improvement in attendance is not noted, attendance contracts may need to be agreed with support

from the County attendance team if needed. Please help us to ensure all our children are in school as often as they possibly can be.

## Safeguarding



Please can I remind all adults that the use of mobile phones on site is prohibited. This is standard school safeguarding protocol. Please keep your phones in your pockets until leaving the school premises. Thank you.
