COVID GUIDELINES

There are many advantages to being on the gate morning and afternoon. Of course, greeting you all and staying in touch with what is going on, but also keeping an eye on how our COVID guidelines are working on a day-to-day basis.

Could I please remind you all of the following:

DROP OFF and PICK UP

Please do ensure you drop your children off at the correct time. Over half the school has a start time of 9:10am in the morning, yet by 9:10am I am normally standing on the gate alone with very few parents walking past. Equally, 3:15pm sees very few parents left on site. There may well be a temptation to drop off early if you can, or pick up early if you can, but this should only be for those who have siblings with different start and finish times. If that is not the case for you, then please stick to the correct timings.

HIGH TEMPERATURES

As a school, one of the only safeguards we have against the spread of COVID is testing temperatures. If a child is feeling unwell at school then this is something we do as routine.

If your child's temperature is over <u>37.8 c</u> we will ask for the child and other siblings to be collected from school, and you will need to book a PCR test for the child with the temperature (a LFT is not sufficient). In addition to this, the latest guidance advises that even if the PCR test comes back as negative, children can return to school when they've not had a high temperature for 48 hours and feel well.

If at any time you are concerned that your child has COVID symptoms then please book a test.

We understand this is a difficult situation as many children just have normal coughs and colds which result in a rise in temperature, but currently we have no alternatives to this process.

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LATERAL FLOW TESTING (LFT) for parents

For a number of weeks, staff at school have been self-testing twice a week to ensure reduced risk whilst at work. You may now have heard from the government that these LFT kits are now available for parents with school-aged children. Please help us stick to time.

INTERNET SAFETY DAY

Over the past year our children have been online far more than they would normally have been.

Nationally this has resulted in many issues around safety online.

We have on a number of occasions, had contact from the county safeguarding team, highlighting various new websites or Apps that are springing up and causing concern.

Our curriculum always addresses e-safety and as part of this we will be delivering a class internet safety day on Tuesday 30th March.

This will vary in both content and length, which will be appropriate for each year group and contain the key messages about safe use of the internet.

Please ensure:

- You know what your child is accessing online and that it is appropriate for their age.
- That you monitor their screen time.
- You set up Parental controls on your devices should you need to.
- That your child's behaviour online is appropriate and that they do not get drawn in to unkind or inappropriate conversations or comments (even with friends).
- That all school-based systems are used purely for school work and that on screen behaviour matches the behaviour we would expect when in school.

The scheme will see us holding a bank of 20 bikes (including some adult sizes) and will enable us to loan out bikes to family groups for a period of time. Therefore encouraging cycling to school with all the benefits associated.

Currently the project is in its infancy and there is much paperwork and planning to be done, but we are hopeful that by the summer term we will have the scheme up and running (or should I say 'rolling!). Please look out for more details next term.
