In the primary school setting, children encounter various assessments throughout their academic journey. However, it's worth noting that not all year groups have external tests. Specifically, Year 3 and Year 5 do not participate in statutory external assessments.

Here's a quick overview of the external testing schedule:

- Reception: Children undergo the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Profile assessment.
- Year 1: Pupils take the Phonics Screening Check to assess their phonics skills.
- Year 2: Pupils sit Key Stage 1 SATs, which include assessments in reading, writing, and mathematics.
- Year 4: Pupils participate in the Multiplication Tables Check to ensure fluency in multiplication.
- **Year 6:** Pupils take Key Stage 2 SATs, covering English grammar, punctuation, and spelling, reading, and mathematics.

These assessments provide valuable information on pupil progress and areas of development. While Year 3 and Year 5 do not have external tests, they continue to benefit from ongoing teacher assessments to monitor their learning and growth.

As we approach Y6 SATs week, I wanted to take a moment to share some thoughts and encouragement with you all.

Firstly, I want to remind everyone that while SATs are an important part of the school year, they are just one measure of your child's learning journey. It's essential to keep things in perspective and remember that these tests do not define who you are or what you can achieve.

To our Y6 children, I encourage you to do your best. You've worked hard throughout the year, and we are incredibly proud of your efforts and dedication. Remember to stay calm, take deep breaths, and approach each test with confidence. Believe in yourself, and know that you have the support of your teachers and family behind you.

To our parents, thank you for your continued support and encouragement. Please ensure your child gets plenty of rest, eats well, and arrives at school with a positive mindset each day. Don't forget we are offering a free SATs breakfast to all our year 6 children.
