We have taken the decision to continue to let children come to school in their PE kits on their PE days, but there are many children just turning up to school in sports kit that is not part of our uniform. Please can you ensure that your child has the correct PE kit when turning up to school. I understand that as the weather gets colder then your child may need a sweatshirt or top in addition to the t-shirt, but could we please ensure the correct t-shirt is worn (not a football top that is the same colour) Thank you.

# **SWIMMING**

Did you know that only 55% of children can swim in Oxfordshire!!

As part of the national curriculum, it is our aim that all children are able to swim 25 metres by the end of Year 6. Our current system for swimming means that children swim for around 6 weeks in the year and then wait for a year before they swim again. This period of time in the pool does not really give nonswimmers enough time to learn or for those weaker swimmers to properly improve. From January 2022, we will be changing the way swimming is taught at Longfields. Our Year 5s will swim until Easter and then our Year 4s will swim from Easter until the summer break. On our return in September 2022 the Year 5s will swim for the first half of the Year and then it will go back to the Year 4s for the other half.

The way this rotation works, means that children will swim for almost an entire year (split by the summer holiday). There will also be catch up sessions available to our Year 6 non-swimmers in the summer term. Although this means children will not swim at school

until Year 4, it will hopefully mean that more of our pupils become competent swimmers and able to keep themselves safe in water.

What a fantastic couple of days were had at the Cotswold Wildlife Park. After what seems like an eternity of not being able to go on school trips, it was brilliant to be able to take our Year 1s and 2s on a great day out.

# **COVID UPDATES**

It has been good to resume pretty much business as usual this term but that has seen us have more positive COVID cases in the last 5 weeks than we

did in the whole of the last 18 months. You will know that the guidance has changed in terms of pupils only needing to isolate if they test positive. After being identified as a close contact, pupils are asked to undertake a PCR straight away. We have found that In pretty much all cases this comes back as negative because the virus is still within its incubation period. With this in mind we have added a further layer of protection for staff and pupils, and this has an impact on those pupils who are living with someone who is COVID positive. In this instance, we are asking that the pupil undertakes an LFT each morning for the week following their negative PCR test, and only attends school if that test is negative. So far this term, these extra precautions have allowed us to identify 3 or 4 siblings who have tested positive at a later date than their PCR and has therefore helped us keep school a safer place.

#### **HIGH TEMPERATURES**

As a school, one of the only guards we have against the spread of COVID is testing temperatures. If a child is feeling unwell at school, then this is something we do as routine. The result of our temperature test, regardless of any test done at home, has consequences, in that we will ask for the child to have a PCR test (a LFT is not sufficient). In addition to this, the latest guidance asks that even if the PCR test comes back as negative, if the child retains the high temperature, then they should be kept off school until 24 hours after their temperature has returned to normal.

#### **CAR PARK**

#### A reminder that the school car park is for staff

**only**. Please do not use it to drop children off or wait for them at the end of the day. If you are spotted using the car park without permission, please do not be offended when you are asked to leave. This is for the safety of staff and children attending school. Thank you

Some parents are not receiving updates from school via the School Life App because they are only seeing the public site. For safety, school messages are only available to those who have logged in. Parents should log into the app :- just open the app, click the two houses at the top, select log in and enter your user name and password.
